EPHESIANS 3:14-20

10+10 Study Questions

Take time each day this week to spend ten minutes praying and ten minutes studying God's word.

Context:

Ephesians puts personal salvation in the context of a saved community by showing how the people of God throughout history—including both Jews and Gentiles—are now united in Christ and in His church. The letter starts before the first chapter in the Bible, all the way back in eternity past, when God predestined the people he would save in Christ. It sweeps forward to encompass the whole span of salvation, up to and including the glorious inheritance that the Holy Spirit guarantees for every believer in Christ. It ends with God's ultimate victory in the believer's mortal combat with Satan.

This Week's Memory Verse:

"Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us," (Ephesians 3:20 ESV)

1. Read Ephesians 3:14-20.
2. Before whom does Paul kneel?
3. How is the Father described?
4. What does Paul pray for on behalf of his readers in verse 16? How is this accomplished? For what reason (v17)?

Tuesday, October 25th

1. Read Ephesians 3:14-20.
2. What does Paul pray for on behalf of his readers in verse 17?
3. Why would strength be required to comprehend love?
4. Do you think it would take the strengthening of God to understand the lengths God has gone to show his love?

Wednesday, October 26th

1. Read Ephesians 3:14-20.
2. What does Paul pray for on behalf of his readers in verse 19? What is the desired result?
3. Read Colossians 2:6-9. What is the desired result?

Thursday, October 27th

1. Read Ephesians 3:14-20.
2. What has God done that is far more abundant than we could ask or think? According to what power?
3. If that power is at work within us, what does it look like for God to do more than you could imagine in the world around you?

Friday, October 28th

Use Friday as a catch up day.

Saturday, October 29th

Pray for God to move in a powerful way this evening as we start our new series called *Manifest*. This would be an excellent time to invite any of your friends who have considered checking out Revolution. Also, pray that God would help people to find their place within the Missional Communities that have been started.
